NOTICE of INTENTION to DESIGNATE

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Port Hope, on the 19th day of February, 1979, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as 82 Victoria Street South, as a property of architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The Penryn Homestead is recommended for designation on historical grounds as the home of Port Hope's first mayor, John T. Williams, and on architectural grounds as it features the neo-classic style very popular from 1810 to the 1830's.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within 30 days of February 26, 1979.
