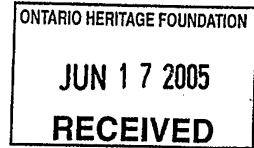

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Municipal Council of The Corporation of the Municipality of Port Hope intends to designate property at the following municipal address as a property of architectural and/or historical value or interest, pursuant to the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.18, Part IV.

Reasons for the Proposed Designation

This house, on what was originally the outskirts of Port Hope, was built in 1834 by the Rev. James Coghlan, Rector of St. John's Church (now St. Mark's) as a combined rectory and grammar school. Erected the same year as the more elaborate Bluestone, it is a simpler example of the early Georgian houses built in Upper Canada. Despite undergoing many changes, including being made into a duplex, the house has retained its essential character. In 1985, the present owners, after returning it to a single family dwelling, have restored it to its former splendour. The designation includes the clapboard and stucco cladding, the verandah, and interior elements that have been conserved or restored.

Information relating to the full particulars of the reasons for designation are available from the Clerk's Office located in the Town Hall at 56 Queen Street, Port Hope.
