IN THE MATTER OF THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT, 1974, S.O. CHAPTER 122 AND IN THE MATTER OF THE LANDS AND PREMISES KNOWN MUNICIPALLY AS THE C.N.R. STATION, IN THE VILLAGE OF HALIBURTON, IN THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO:

## NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the Municipality of Dysart et al on the 14th day of August, 1978, decided to designate the lands and buildings known Municipally as the C.N.R. Station as a property of historical value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

> SHORT STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION

The C.N.R. Station is recommended for designation for architectural and historical reasons. Constructed in 1878, this 100 year old structure stands as a monument to a bygone era when steam locomotives were the backbone of commerce and travel in Haliburton County. The station is also important as a well designed and quite well preserved wood frame structure of the late 19th century. The building will be resurrected to take its place in the local history of the past century. Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of December 13, 1978.
