NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 1st day of October, 1975, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as 107-109 Wellington Street West, as a property of historical and architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The Toronto Club, Nos.107-109 Wellington Street West at York Street (SE), 1888, 1912 by Darling Pearson.

The Toronto Club is recommended for designation as one of the oldest club buildings in the City and at the same time as a notable example of the work of an important firm of architects working in the Richardsonian Romanesque style. The building is also important for the humanizing effect of its smaller scale and warmly-toned materials amidst the extensive rebuilding of the downtown core.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of October 10th, 1975.
