CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF ALMONTE

BY-LAW NO. 29-1990

BEING a By-law to designate the premises known municipally as 153 Reserve Street, as being of architectural and historical value and interest.

WHEREAS the Ontario Heritage Foundation Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337, authorizes the Council of a Municipality to enact By-laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon to be of architectural value or interest; and

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Almonte has caused to be served on the owner of the building situated on Part Lot 6 Riddell Section Plan 6262, Town of Almonte and upon The Ontario Heritage Foundation notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and have caused such notice of intention to so designate, to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the Municipality, once a week for three consecutive weeks; and

WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Clerk of the Municipality;

THEREFORE, the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Almonte enacts as follows:

1. There is designated as being of architectural and historical value and interest, the real property known as 153 Reserve Street, Town of Almonte.
2. The municipal Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-law to be registered against the property described, in the proper Land Registry Office.
3. The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-law to be served on The Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of the passing of this By-law to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the Municipality, once a week for three consecutive weeks.
4. That Schedule "A" hereto attached shall form part of this By-law.

READ a first, second and third time and finally passed this 10th day of July, 1990.

SHORT STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION

The Loyal Orange Lodge has served as an important element for the Loyal Orange community in Almonte. Many of Almonte's most illustrious citizens have belonged to the Loyal Orange Lodge over the years.

The building is an early example of stone residential architecture in Almonte. It follows the design of the "Almonte" style - heavily massed structures of Beckwith stone.
