

BY-LAW NO. 95-225

A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE 19 - 23 QUEEN STREET TO BE OF HISTORICAL AND OR ARCHITECTURAL VALUE OR INTEREST, PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT (CLAUSE 2, REPORT NO. 94)

PASSED: August 29, 1995

WHEREAS Notice of Intention to Designate 19 - 23 Queen Street to be of historical and or architectural value or interest, pursuant to Section 29 of the *Ontario Heritage Act*, was sent by registered mail to the owners of the property and to the Ontario Heritage Foundation on the 28th day of June, 1995;

AND WHEREAS said Notice was published in the Whig Standard on Wednesday, July 5, 1995, Wednesday, July 12, 1995 and Wednesday, July 19, 1995;

AND WHEREAS the thirty day appeal period expired on August 4, 1995;

AND WHEREAS no objection to such designation has been received:

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Kingston hereby enacts as follows:

1. 19 - 23 Queen Street in the City of Kingston is hereby designated to be of historical and or architectural value or interest for the following reasons:

"19 - 23 Queen Street is of architectural and historic significance. Built in 1849 and 1904-11 the buildings in this row are excellent examples of stone commercial buildings of the 1840's contrasted with a brick and glass building of

the 20th century. The first stone building was built for the Kingston Gaslight Company in 1848 and added to later. When the City bought the company in 1904 it made alterations to the stone buildings and commissioned William Newlands to design the large brick and glass building on the corner."

2. The subject property is more particularly described in the Schedule "A" attached hereto and forming part of this By-Law.

3. The City Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-Law and the reasons for designation to be registered against the lands described in Schedule "A" attached hereto in the Land Registry Office at Kingston, Ontario.

4. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-Law to be served on the owners of the lands described in Schedule "A" hereto and on the Ontario Heritage Foundation, and to cause notice of the passing of this By-Law to be published in the Whig Standard once for each of three consecutive weeks.

5. This By-Law shall come into force and take effect on the date of its passing.
