

A by-law of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa to designate 152 Bay Street to be of historic and architectural value or interest.

WHEREAS the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of historic and architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa has caused to be served upon the owners of the lands and premises known as 152 Bay Street more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in the Ottawa Journal newspaper having a general circulation in the City of Ottawa, once a week for three consecutive weeks, namely on March 1st, 8th and 15th, 1978;

AND WHEREAS notice of objection to the said proposed designation was served upon the Clerk of the municipality;

AND WHEREAS a Hearing was convened before the Conservation Review Board pursuant to the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act;

AND WHEREAS by a Report dated October 25, 1979 the Conservation Review Board recommended that 152 Bay Street be designated as a property of historic and architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa on October 7, 1981 considered the Report of the Conservation Review Board and confirmed the intention to designate;

AND WHEREAS the reasons for the designation are set out as Schedule "B" hereto;

particularly excellent leaded windows in the front bay and facade.
The residence is also an important element in the heritage area
under study by the City along Queen Street from Bay Street to
Bronson Avenue.

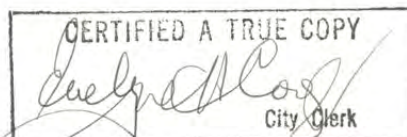
THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa enacts as follows:

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises, situate, lying and being in the City of Ottawa, Regional Municipality of Ottawa-Carleton and Province of Ontario, BEING COMPOSED OF part of Lot 18, numbering westward, on the south side of Queen Street, according to a plan filed in the Land Registry Office for the Land Registry Division of Ottawa-Carleton number 5 as number 3922, and being designated as Part 3 on a Plan of Survey deposited in the Land Registry Office for the Land Registry Division of Ottawa-Carleton number 5 as number 5R-6044.
