BY-LAW NUMBER ... 300-80....

A by-law of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa to designate 156 - 158 Sparks Street to be of architectural value or interest;

WHEREAS The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, Statutes of Ontario, 1974, Chapter 122, as amended, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa has caused to be served upon the owners of the lands and premises known as 156 - 158 Sparks Street , more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in the Journal newspaper having a general circulation in the City of Ottawa, once a week for three consecutive weeks, namely on the 7th, 14th and 21st days of December, 1977

AND WHEREAS notice of objection to the said proposed designation was served upon the Clerk of the municipality;

AND WHEREAS a Hearing was convened before the Conservation Review Board pursuant to the provisions of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974;

AND WHEREAS by a Report dated May 31, 1979 the

Conservation Review Board recommended that 156 - 158 Sparks

Street be designated as a property of architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa on February 20, 1980 considered the Report of the Conservation Review Board and confirmed the intention to designate;

AND WHEREAS the reasons for the designation are set out as Schedule "B" hereto;

THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa enacts as follows:-

There is designated as being of architectural

value or interest the real property, more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, known as 156 - 158 Sparks Street

- 2. The City Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper Land Registry Office.
- 3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owners of the property described in Schedule "A", and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having a general circulation in the City of Ottawa.
- 4. The schedules attached hereto and marked Schedule "A" and Schedule "B" form part of this by-law and all notations, references and other information contained therein shall be as much a part of this by-law as if all the matters and information set forth by the said schedules were all fully described herein.

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises, situate, lying and being in the City of Ottawa, Regional Municipality of Ottawa-Carleton and Province of Ontario, and BEING COMPOSED OF Lot 13, numbering eastward, on the south side of Sparks Street and Lot 13, numbering eastward, on the northside of Queen Street, according to a plan filed in the Land Registry Office for the Registry Division of Ottawa-Carleton Number 5 as number 3922.

This commercial building at 156-158 Sparks Street is recommended for designation for architectural interest.
