NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

To: Ontario Heritage Foundation, 77 Bloor Street Nest, Toronto, Ontario. M7A 2R9.

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Cobalt intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, at the following municipal address as a property of architectural and/or historical value or interest under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

Municipal Address: 12 Prospect Avenue, Cobalt, Ontario.

Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The Bank of Commerce, built in the fall of 1905, is recommended for designation for architectural and historical reasons. This pre-fabricated two storey wood frame building, with its interupted gambrel roof and inset porch, is Cobalt's Earliest surviving public building and one of the few remaining examples of the Bank of Commerce pre-fabs that once dotted Western Canada. Despite the changes in the porch columns, windows, porch stairs and sheathing material, this building, unique in the Cobalt area in its "West Cost" building style, retains much of its historic character.
