TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Richmond Hill intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, at the following municipal address as a property of architectural and/or historical value or interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1980, R.S.O. Chapter 337:

19 Church Street North, Richmond Hill, Ontario (known as Amos Wright House)

## Reasons for Proposed Designation

This building is recommended for designation for both architectural and historical reasons. Built c 1840 in a vernacular derivative of the Regency style, the single storey house has a classically detailed front door with sidelights. Corner boards repeat the classical effect by their resemblance to pilasters. Other Regency features are the high basement, long hipped roof and wide eaves.

Original owner Amos Wright was first reeve of Markham (1850) and MPP for East York (1851-67). He was MP for West York for the 4 years following Confederation. A prominent member of the community, he campaigned for village incorporation for more than ten years. Wright Street was named for him.
