NOTICE OF THE PASSING OF A DESIGNATION BY-LAW BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF WATERLOO

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Waterloo passed By-law No. <u>06-097</u> on the 21st day of August, 2006, under section 41 of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. O.18, as amended.

AND TAKE NOTICE any person or agency may appeal a by-law to the Ontario Municipal Board in respect of the By-law by filing with the Clerk of the Corporation of the City of Waterloo not later than the 29th day of September 2006, a Notice of Appeal setting out the objection to the by-law and the reasons in support of the objection, accompanied by a fee of \$125.00 made payable to the Minister of Finance as prescribed under the Ontario Municipal Board Act.

AN EXPLANATION of the purpose and effect of the by-law and a map showing the location of the lands to which the by-law applies, is attached. The complete by-law is available for inspection in the Development Services Department, 2nd floor, Waterloo City Centre during regular office hours.
