BY-LAW LUMBER 354-78.

A by-law of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa to designate The Langevin Block, Wellington Street to be of historic or architectural value or interest.

UHEREAS The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of historic or architectural value or interest;

AND UNEXEAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa has caused to be served upon the owner of the lands and premises known as The Langevin Block, Wellington Street, more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in The Ottawa Journal newspaper having a general circulation in the City of Ottawa, once a week for three consecutive weeks, namely on February 21, February 28 and March 7, 1978;

AND WHEREAS the reasons for the designation are set out as Schedule "B" hereto;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the said proposed designation has been served upon the Clerk of the municipality;

THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa enacts as follows:

- 2. The City Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper Land Registry office.

- 3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the coner of the property described in Schedule "A", and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having a general circulation in the City of Ottawa.
- 4. The schedules attached hereto and marked Schedule "A" and Schedule "B" form part of this by-law and all notations, references and other information contained therein shall be as much a part of this by-law as if all the matters and information set forth by the said schedules were all fully described herein.

NOTICE OF BY-LAW

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa on the 18th day of October, 1978, enacted By-law Number 354-78, designating the lands and buildings known municipally as Langevin Block, Wellington Street, as a property of architectural and historical value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act 1974, Statutes of Ontario, 1974, Chapter 122.

STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR THE DESIGNATION:

"The Langevin Block is recommended for designation as being of architectural and historical value. Constructed 1884-1888, the building is of Italiante style, "freely and boldly treated". The excellent composition was designed by Thomas Fuller, the Chief Architect of the Department of Public Works. The massive exterior of warm sandstone features bold round-arched windows, a prominent cornice and a tower copper-clad mansard roof. The Langevin Block was constructed to provide urgently needed office space and thus is a significant expression of the development and growth of the Federal Government and of its influence in the life of Ottawa.
