NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa on the 7th day of September, 1977, decided to designate the lands and buildings known as The Langevin Block, Wellington Street in the City of Ottawa as a property of architectural and historical value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, Statutes of Ontario, 1974, Chapter 122.

SHORT STATEMENT OF REASON FOR THE PROPOSES DESIGNATION:

The Langevin Block is recommended for designation as being of architectural and historical value. Constructed 1884-1888, the building is of Italianate style, "freely and boldly treated". The excellent composition was designed by Thomas Fuller, the Chief Architect of the Department of Public Works. The massive exterior of warm sandstone features bold round-arched windows, a prominent cornice and a towering copper-clad mansard roof. The Langevin Block was constructed to provide urgently needed office space and thus is a significant expression of the development and growth of the Federal Government and of its influence in the life of Ottawa. Expansion of the federal offices beyond Parliament Hill and the partial closure of the historic space created by the original government buildings marked a major step in Ottawa's evolution.

NOTICE OF OBJECTION to the designation may be served on the Clerk, within thirty (30) days of the 21st day of February, , 1978.
