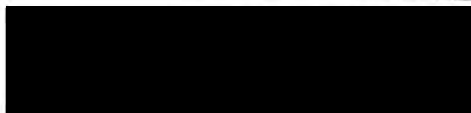

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

To:



Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Brantford, on the 25th day of August, 1977, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as 20 and 22 Nelson Street, as a property of historical value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons
for the Proposed Designation:

The Tisdale House is recommended for designation on architectural grounds as one of the oldest Italianate villas in Brantford. It was erected between 1866 and 1867. It has also some historical association with Mrs. William Brooks who sang over the telephone for guests gathered at Tutela Heights for the second testing of Alexander Graham Bell's new invention in August, 1876.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the City Clerk within thirty days of the 3rd day of September, 1977.
