

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Cramahe intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, at the following municipal address as a property of architectural and historical value or interest under Part 1V of the Ontario Heritage Act. 1974, S. O. Chapter 122

(a) Lot 21, Conc. 1, Township of Cramahe.

Salem United Church, built in 1861 is recommended for designation, for architectural reasons, as it is an early example of rural public design, skilfully using local material and craftmanship. Historically, the building has served as a focal point for activities, as well as a religious observance and as a community symbol for 117 years. The church epitomises and reflects the nature of the surrounding district and is located on "The Heritage Highway".

Notice of objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts may be served on the Clerk of the Township of Cramahe before the 24th. day of February 1979.
