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THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF CALEDON BY-LAW NUMBER 2005-141

Being a by-law to repeal the designation of the Cataract bridge under the Ontario Heritage Act

WHEREAS on April 15, 1985 the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Caledon enacted By-law No. 85-46 pursuant to Section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act for the purpose of designating the property on which the Cataract Bridge (the wooden trestle bridge spanning what was the CP Rall tracks and is now the Orangeville – Brampton railway in the Forks of the Credit Provincial Park south of Cataract) is located to be of historical value or interest;

AND WHEREAS, because of its unsafe condition, the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Caledon, on August 9, 2005, consented to the demolition and removal of the Cataract Bridge pursuant to Section 34 of the Ontario Heritage Act;

AND WHEREAS, where a municipal council has given its consent to the demolition or removal of a building or structure that is located on a property that has been designated under Section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act, Section 34.3 of the Ontario Heritage Act requires that the municipal council enact a by-law repealing the by-law by which the property was designated:

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Caledon enacts that By-law No. 85-46 shall be and is hereby repealed.
