A by-law to designate the Preston Public Utilities Commission Building, 506 King Street, Cambridge, Ontario, as being of architectural value and of historic interest.

WHEREAS The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of historic or architectural value or interest; and

WHEREAS Notice of Intention to so designate the Preston Public Utilities Commission Building, 506 King Street, Cambridge, Ontario, has been duly published and served; and

WHEREAS it is considered desirable to designate the property known as the Preston Public Utilities Commission Building, 506 King Street, Cambridge, Ontario.

NOW THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. There is designated as being of architectural and historic value or interest, the exterior of the original stone structure located on the real property, more particularly described in Schedule "A" attached hereto, known as the Preston Public Utilities Commission Building, 506 King Street, Cambridge, Ontario. The reasons for the designation are set out in Schedule "B" attached hereto.

2. The City of Cambridge is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the said property and upon The Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the City of Cambridge.

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the City of Cambridge, in the Regional Municipality of Waterloo and Province of Ontario, formerly in the <u>Town of Preston</u>, and being composed of parts of Lots Numbers Twenty-Nine (29) and Thirty (30), South of King Street and West of Potter Street, Plan 521, which said parts of Lots Numbers Twenty-Nine (29) and Thirty (30) may be more particularly described as follows:

COMMENCING at the most Northerly angle of said Lot Thirty (30) being also the South East corner of King Street and Waterloo Street; THENCE S 37° 00' W one hundred and sixteen (116) feet to a stake; THENCE S 53° 00' E and parallel with King Street, one hundred (100) feet to a stake;

THENCE N 37° 00' E one hundred and sixteen (116) feet to the South side of King Street;

THENCE N 53° 00' W one hundred (100) feet to the place of beginning. These are all of the lands described in Instrument Number E 18680.
