BY-LAW NO. 1766

OF THE

CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE

A by-law to designate the William Crane Cottage, 28 Cameron Street, Cambridge, Ontario, as being of architectural value and of historic interest.

WHEREAS The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of historic or architectural value or interest; and

WHEREAS Notice of Intention to so designate the William Crane Cottage, 28 Cameron Street, Cambridge, Ontario, has been duly published and served; and

WHEREAS it is considered desirable to designate the property known as the William Crane Cottage, 28 Cameron Street, Cambridge, Ontario.

NOW THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. There is designated as being of architectural and historic value or interest, the exterior of the roughcast plaster cottage, located on the real property, more particularly described in Schedule 'A' attached hereto, known as the William Crane Cottage, 28 Cameron Street, Cambridge, Ontario.* The reasons for the designation are set out in Schedule 'B' attached hereto.

2. The City of Cambridge is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the said property and upon The Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the City of Cambridge.

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises, situate, lying and being in the City of Cambridge, in the Regional Municipality of Waterloo, and Province of Ontario, <u>formerly in the</u> <u>City of Galt</u>, and being composed of Lot 52, Plan 441, and known municipally as 28 Cameron Street, Cambridge, Ontario.

SCHEDULE "B" TO BY-LAW NO. 1766

OF THE

CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE

The William Crane Cottage is designated for architectural reasons.

Built by William Crane, a carpenter, as his home, it stands as a well-preserved example of a roughcast plaster cottage of the midnineteenth century. The building incorporates picturesque features including dentils and pairs of Italianate brackets at the cornice and moulded, shaped wood lintels surmounting double sash windows (many with the original glazing pattern) and the panelled main door. The main door also shows wood pilasters with moulded capitals, sidelights, transom light and panelled embrasure.

With its twin next door, Number 26 Cameron Street, the William Crane Cottage integrates well into a streetscape of yellow brick or plaster houses, situated at a similar setback and shaded by mature maple trees.
