BY-LAW NO. 79-9

BEING A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE C.N.R. STATION OF HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL VALUE OR INTEREST

WHEREAS, the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of historical and architectural value or interest; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Corporation of the United Townships of Dysart, Dudley, Harcourt, Guilford, Harburn, Bruton, Havelock, Eyre and Clyde has caused to be served upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the municipality for each of three consecutive weeks; and

WHEREAS, the reasons for designation are set out in Schedule "B" hereto; and

WHEREAS, no notice of objection to the said proposed designation has been served upon the clerk of the municipality;

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE UNITED TOWNSHIPS OF DYSART ET AL ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- There is designated as being of architectural and historical value or interest the real property more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, known as the C.N.R. Station.
- 2. The Municipal Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper land registry office.
- 3. The Municipal Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon The Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the Municipality of Dysart et al.

<u>READ</u> a first, second and third time, finally passed, signed and sealed this 15th day of January, 1979.

## SCHEDULE "A"

ALL AND SINGLUAR that certain parcel or tract of land, situate, lying and being in the Township of Dysart, in the Provisional County of Haliburton, being composed of Part of Lots 2,8 and 9, Block "L", in the Town Plot of the village of Haliburton and being more particularly designated as Part 1 on a Plan of Survey by Bishop & Wilson, dated January 17, 1979, to be received and deposited in the Registry Office for the Registry Division of the Provisional County of Haliburton.

## SCHEDULE "B"

Reasons for the designation of the C.N.R. Station:

The C.N.R. Station is recommended for designation for architectural and historical reasons. Constructed in 187%, this 100 year old structure stands as a monument to a bygone era when steam locomotives were the backbone of commerce and travel in Haliburton County. The station is also important as a well designed and well preserved wood frame structure of the late 19th century. The building will be resurrected to take its place in the local history of the past century.
