SHORT STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION

The store created to service the needs of one Pine Logging firm remains our best link with that part of our original main industry, it is separated in its location from the influence of modern building materials and this retains its unique style in a one of a kind place in our history.

The presence of this building prevents the question being asked in what setting and method was shopping carried out in the Village past. The efficiency of service to customers has been equal in a store of high ceilings, counters and shelving of the 1800's. Successive owners have beleived the retention of the past has served their need of profit and service to their customers. Further, the building has proven to be a highlight of the Heritage Walks carried out in the Village.
