QUEEN'S LAWN CEMETERY GATES 109 MAIN STREET EAST

THE REASON for the proposed designation is to recognize the gates at the entrance of the Queen's Lawn Cemetery, the first town cemetery.

The entrance gates to Queen's Lawn Cemetery were erected in 1921 as a memorial to the citizens of Grimsby and North Grimsby who gave their lives during World War I. The gates were erected with funds provided by the women of the district who saved and collected donations.

ANY PERSON may within thirty days of the publication of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of The Corporation of the Town of Grimsby his or her objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. When a Notice of Objection has been received, the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Grimsby will refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing and report.
