By-law No. 96-7

A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE PROPERTY KNOWN MUNICIPALLY AS 212 MAIN STREET EAST, AS BEING OF ARCHITECTURAL AND/OR HISTORICAL VALUE OR INTEREST

WHEREAS Section 29 of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.18, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural or historic value or interest; and

WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Grimsby has caused to be served on the owners of the lands and premises known municipally as 212 Main Street East, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks; and

WHEREAS the reasons for designation are set out in Schedule 'B' hereto; and

WHEREAS no Notice of Objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Town Administrator of the municipality; and

THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF GRIMSBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- There is designated as being of architectural and/or historical value or interest the real property known municipally as 212 Main Street East more particularly described in Schedule 'A' attached hereto.
- 2. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule 'A' attached hereto in the proper land registry office.
- The Town Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served on the owner of the aforementioned property and on the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of the passing of this by-law to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks.

READ A FIRST TIME this 19th day of February, 1996.

READ A SECOND AND THIRD TIME AND FINALLY PASSED this 19th day of Feburary, 1996.

## SCHEDULE "B"

## 212 MAIN STREET EAST, GRIMSBY, ONTARIO

The house at 212 Main Street East was built in 1860-67 by William Dennis Kitchen. He was the grandson of William Kitchen and Alice Beam who came to Upper Canada from New Jersey before 1790. William served on Grimsby Township Council on several occasions, including a term as overseer of roads in 1791.

By 1901 the Kitchen farm on this property produced a crop of peaches, grapes, apples, pears, plums, cherries, raspberries and strawberries. The Kitchen family owned the house continuously until 1959. The last members of the Kitchen family to own the house were Olive and Fred Kitchen, grandchildren of William Dennis Kitchen, who regularly took summer tourists into their home.

Sometime after the turn of the century, the upper storey of the house was destroyed by fire. When it was rebuilt, the three gables of the original house were replaced by the present upper storey with a hip roof.
