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

BY-LAW NO. 96-116

A By-law to designate the property at 479 Vine Street to be of historic or architectural value or interest.

WHEREAS the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. 0.18, authorizes the council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate property within the municipality to be of historic or architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS property under the Ontario Heritage Act means real property and includes all buildings or structures thereon;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of St. Catharines has caused to be served upon the owner of the property described in Schedule "A" hereto, known as No. 479 Vine Street, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation notice of intention to designate the property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in a newspaper having a general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks;

AND WHEREAS the reasons for designation are set out as Schedule "B" hereto;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served upon the Clerk of the City of St. Catharines.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF ST. CATHARINES enacts as follows:

The property, more particularly described in Schedule-"A" attached hereto, 1. known as No. 479 Vine Street, is hereby designated to be of historic or architectural value or interest.

# SCHEDULE "B" TO BY-LAW NO. 96-116

#### HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE

This one and one-half storey brick veneer home was built around 1870 for Margaret Gibson. The former farmhouse is one of a relatively few remaining structures of its kind in north St. Catharines which, at one time was made up primarily of agricultural uses.

This one and one-half storey, brick house has centre gables on the front and side facades. A decorative bargeboard can be found in the centre gables. The house has a square plan with an addition to the rear. The hip roof has a boxed cornice and frieze. All of the main floor windows are in segmental openings with radiating voussoirs. The windows in the gable peaks have flat heads with stone lintels. All of the windows are double hung in a two over two pane arrangement. There are two brick chimney stacks, one at the front and one at the rear of the roof. One interesting feature of the house is that above the door is a segmental transom which opens for ventilation.
