Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

Scadding House is recommended for designation as a property of architectural and historic value. Designed by William Hay, c.1861, it is a notable example of the early residential architecture of Toronto, given a gothic form to complement the character of the Church of the Holy Trinity. The house has historic significance as the home of Dr. Henry Scadding, one of Toronto's first and most important historians.
