
Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of
the City of Toronto, on the 17th day of January, 1977, decided
to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as 10
Trinity Square, as a property of architectural value or interest
under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

10 Trinity Square (Holy Trinity Rectory). The Gothic
Revival details of the house, which is essentially rural in
character, relate its design significantly to that of the adja-
cent church. Built about 1861, it is an important element in
architectural context with nearby Scadding House and the Church
of the Holy Trinity.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on
the Clerk within thirty days of the 28th day of January, 1977.
