
Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 12th day of May, 1976, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as 6-14 Irwin Avenue, as a property of architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The row of houses at 6-14 Irwin Avenue, built c.1884, is recommended for designation for architectural reasons as a representative example of the row housing of the 1880's. It is especially important in the context of the streetscape because of the tower of No. 10 which accents the centre of the block and is balanced by the dormers and projecting bay windows of the side units, giving the street development an overall unity rare in speculative building.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of the 18th day of June, 1976. (File 1156).
