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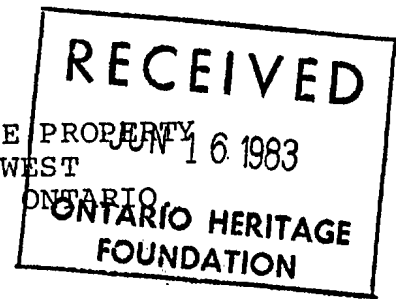

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City
of Toronto, on the 30th day of May, 1983, decided to designate
the lands and buildings known municipally as No.11 Wellington
Street West as a property of architectural value or interest,
under the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337.

Short Statement of Reasons for the Proposed Designation

No.11 Wellington Street West (warehouse) is recommended for design-
ation for architectural reasons. Built in 1854-55 by John Dixon,
and designed by William Hay, Architect, this building was first
occupied by John Henderson, Merchant. The shopfront is detailed
in stone with Tuscan columns. The brickwork in the two floors
above defines inset windows, spandrels and pilasters trimmed in
arched stonework below the cornice. The attic storey, possibly
added in 1867, reflects the brick detailing below and the pilasters
are capped with a distinctive "moulded block" above the roof line.
It is a rare example of the work of an early Toronto architect
within the context of an important group of heritage buildings.
