THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF THOROLD

BY-LAW NO. 26-99

A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE WAR MEMORIAL MONUMENT AS BEING OF HISTORIC VALUE OR INTEREST.

WHEREAS:

- 1. Section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.18 authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate a property within the municipality including all buildings and structures thereon to be of historic or architectural value or interest.
- 2. The City owns the Lands.
- 3. Council has served the Notice upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation providing Notice of Intention to designate the monument on the Lands as being of historic or architectural value or interest and has caused such Notice of Intention to be published in the Thorold News, a newspaper having general circulation in the municipality on the 20th day of March, 1999.
- 4. No Notice of Objection to the proposed designation has been served upon the City.

NOW THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF THOROLD ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. In this by-law and its preambles:
 - (a) "Building" means any premises or structures on the Lands.
 - (b) "City" means the Corporation of the City of Thorold;
 - (c) "Council" means the Council of the City;
 - "Designated" or "Designation" means the designating of the monument on the Lands to be of historic or architectural value or interest pursuant to the relevant provisions in the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.18 as amended;
 - (e) "Lands" means lands and premises and buildings or improvements thereon described in Schedule "A" annexed hereto and made part of this by-law on which the monument is located;
 - (f) "Monument" means the War Memorial Monument known as the Soldiers' Monument located in "Memorial Park", 13 Albert Street East, in the City;
 - (g) "Notice of Intention" means the Notice set out in Schedule "B" annexed to and made part of this by-law.

- 2. The Monument is designated as being of historic value and interest.
- 3. The Municipal Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law and a copy of the reasons for designation, as stated in Schedule "B" to this by-law, to be registered on the title to the lands at the Registry Office for the Registry Division of Niagara South at Welland.
- 4. The Clerk of the City is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause Notice of the passing of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the City.

The War Memorial Monument known as the Soldiers' Monument commemorates The Great War I - 1914 - 1919, World War II - 1939 - 1945 and the Korean War.

Thorold's War Memorial, located in Memorial Park, was unveiled on Sunday, October 30, 1921 and was erected by the citizens of Thorold to:

"Honour the Memory of the Men of Thorold, who gave their lives for the cause of freedom in the great war, and in grateful remembrance of those who shared its dangers."

The War Memorial is a landmark in our City and an important part of our history. Our whole community, through this memorial, shows their reverence and respect for those citizens who served their country and who made the ultimate sacrifice. Designation of this memorial under the Ontario Heritage Act serves to recognize, protect and celebrate this landmark as an important part of our history, and as a dedication to those who fought for freedom.

This designation is for the historical aspects of the monument.

Any person may object to the proposed designation within thirty (30) days after the date of the first publication of the Notice of Intention by serving on the Clerk of the Corporation of the City of Thorold a Notice of Objection setting out the reason for the objection and all relevant facts. The last day for filing objections will be Monday, April 19, 1999. All objections within the aforementioned time period will be referred to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing and report.
