



AND IN THE MATTER OF THE DESIGNATION OF THE PROPERTY KNOWN MUNICIPALLY AS 201 COWAN AVENUE IN THE CITY OF TORONTO, IN THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 28th day of May, 1984 decided to designate the lands and buildings known municipally as 201 Cowan Avenue (St. Mark's Church) as a property of architectural and historical value or interest, under the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337.

Short Statement of Reasons for the Proposed Designation

The Church of the Epiphany and St. Mark, Parkdale, (formerly St. Mark's Church) at 201 Cowan Avenue is recommended for designation for architectural and historical reasons. Replacing an 1877 mission church, the present building was designed by Architects, Langley, Langley & Burke and built in 1881. Reflecting the Gothic style of small parish churches of the mid-19th century in England, the building includes distinctive polychrome brickwork, low buttressed side walls, a steeply pitched roof, an octagonal belfry with spire and metalwork, and a great variety of stained glass. The church is part of a locally important group of buildings that formed a centre for the Village of Parkdale.

Notice of the Objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of the 12th day of June, 1984.
