THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF SAULT STE. MARIE

BY-LAW NO. 81-19

A by-law to designate the property known municipally as Bishop Fauquier Memorial Chapel at 1540 Queen Street East as being of architectural and historical value or interest.

WHEREAS Section 29 of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974 authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural or historic value or interest; and

WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Sault Ste. Marie has caused to be served on the owners of the lands and premises at 1540 Queen Street East and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality for each of three consecutive weeks; and

WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the clerk of the municipality;

THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Sault Ste. Marie, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. There is designated as being of architectural and historical value or interest the real property known as BISHOP FAUQUIER MEMORIAL CHAPEL, 1540 Queen Street East, more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto.
