


NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Centre Wellington intends to designate the following properties as properties of cultural architectural and/or historical value or interest under Part IV of the *Ontario Heritage Act*, R.S.O. 1990, as amended, (Ch.O.18, Sec. 29):

36 David St East, Elora

Cultural Heritage Value:

Constructed in 1895 by a named builder, William H. Stafford Sr., this single, detached, two storey residential house is made of stretcher brick with quoins and some decorative brick.

168 Geddes St., Elora

Cultural Heritage Value:

This building is a fine example of a 3-bay frame working man's cottage. Built in the early 1860's, it remains significantly unaltered, although the front door originally faced Henderson Street. Alexander Cuthbert lived here to be close to his work as carriage and wagon manufacturers, in partnership with George Noble.

220 Bridge Street, Fergus (Known as the Beatty Coach House)

Cultural Heritage Value:

It is believed to have been built at the same time as the house in 1912 for W.G. Beatty and his wife, including the wishing well and rock garden. This building was first the stable and then the garage.
