BY-LAW NUMBER 12085

A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE LANDS AND PREMISES SITUATE WITHIN THE CITY OF WINDSOR, KNOWN AS 567 CHURCH STREET, TO BE OF ARCHITECTURAL AND/OR HISTORIC VALUE OR SIGNIFICANCE UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT, R.S.O. 1990, CHAPTER 0.18, AS AMENDED.

Passed the 16th day of January, 1995.

WHEREAS by virtue of the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.18, as amended, the Council of a municipality may, by by-law, designate a property within the municipality to be of historic or architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS upon consideration of the recommendation of the Windsor Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee, The Corporation of the City of Windsor deems it desirable and expedient to designate the property described in Schedule "A" annexed hereto and forming part of this by-law, municipally known as 567 Church Street, in the City of Windsor (the "subject property"), to be of historic or architectural value or interest, for the reasons stated in Schedule "B" annexed hereto and forming part of this by-law;

AND WHEREAS notice of intention to so designate the subject property was served on the owner(s) of the subject property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, and such notice was published in a newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once a week for three consecutive weeks;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection was served on the Clerk of the Corporation.

THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Windsor enacts as follows:

- That the above defined subject property be and the same is hereby designated to be of architectural and/or historic value or interest.
- That this by-law shall come into force and effect after the final passing thereof on the day upon which it is registered in the Land Registry Office for Essex (No. 12).

REASONS FOR DESIGNATION

Historical

Built C. 1895 for Daniel Revell, a conductor on the Great Western and the Wabash Railroads and owned by his daughter, Mrs. J. Eugene D'Avignon, wife of the Sheriff of Essex County and their daughter, Helen Eugenie D'Avignon, until 1948.

Architectural

- Queen Anne Revival style house, with extensive wooden architectural detail and wooden clapboard.
- Representative of the quality of houses which once lined Church Street and other early Windsor streets.
