## NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 17th and 19th days of September, 1975, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as 119-121 Bond Street, as a property of architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122. The reason for the proposed designation is that the property is a fine example of the Romanesque revival style applied to synagogue design. It has an interesting interior and also incorporates techniques and materials such as concrete that were relatively uncommon at the time. The building is also important in contextual terms as part of the Bond Street-Church Street group of religious buildings which extends from Gould Street to King Street. As one of the first major synagogue buildings in Canada, is is also of historical importance.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of September 26th 1975.
