NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

To:

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of
Toronto, on the 17th and 19th days of September, 1975, decided to designate
the lands and buildings, known municipally as 131 Farnham Avenue,
as a property of architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage
Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122. The reason for the proposed designation is
that the property is a fine example of High Victorian domestic architecture,
complete in almost all of its details, including some of the interior fittings.
The building is also important historically for its association with an
important Toronto businessman and National statesman, and with the McCormick
agricultural implement family. In streetscape terms, the building is
the eastern-most house of the series that crown the escarpment above Toronto
and its open gardens provide important greenspace in the area.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of September 26th 1975.
