Take notice that the Council of the Corporation  
of the Borough of North York on the 5th day of  
December, 1977 decided to designate the lands and  
buildings, known municipally as 101 Senlac Drive as a  
property of historic and architectural value or interest  
under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed  
Designation:

Michael Shepard House, 1851. The building is recom-  
mended for designation on architectural grounds because  
it is a fine illustration of a rural house designed in  
the Georgian style. The yellow-patterned red brick  
structure exhibits typical Georgian styling with its  
solid, simple form and symmetrical plan. Michael Shepard  
took an active role in Mackenzie's 1837 Rebellion and  
after his subsequent arrest he was part of the historical  
group of fifteen who escaped from the Kingston Penitentiary.  
After receiving his pardon in 1843 Shepard returned to the  
area as a miller, before building this house in 1851.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served  
on the Clerk within thirty days of April 7th, 1978.
