TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Tillsonburg intends to designate the properties, including lands and buildings, at the following municipal addresses as properties of architectural and/or historical value of interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

(a) 94 ROLPH STREET

Architecturally, this is an excellent example of the Italianate style, built about 1880, and typical of the better buildings of the era, with features unique in the area.

Therefore, because of its architectural significance, the Council of the Town of Tillsonburg recommends that the exterior of this building be designated as a heritage building to retain its original character. This however does not include a planned and approved addition to the rear, which will be done in a style compatible with the original.

(b) AVONDALE UNITED CHURCH (60 Harvey Street)

Built in 1885, this is Tillsonburg's oldest religious structure, and architecturally the most significant. Its style is Early English Gothic with a four-sided spire.

Therefore, because of its architectural and historic significance, the Council of the Town of Tillsonburg recommends that the exterior of the Church (excepting the 1960 addition to the south), be designated as a heritage building, to retain its original character.

Notice of objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts may be served on the Clerk of the Town of Tillsonburg before the 19th day of July, 1981.
