Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 21st day of May, 1985 decided to designate the lands and buildings known municipally as 1089 Queen Street West (former YMCA, 1889) as a property of architectural and historical value or interest, under the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337.

Short Statement of Reasons for the Proposed Designation

[The property at 1089 Queen Street West is recommended for designation for architectural and historical reasons. Built in 1889, it was designed for the YMCA by the Toronto architectural firm of Gordon & Helliwell in the High Victorian style, with a corner oriel window and an asymmetrical roofline with projecting turret, spire and chimneys. The varied fenestration, and the exterior stone work are well crafted. The interior includes a gymnasium, and an assembly hall with balcony. Acquired in 1939 by the Polish National Union it has been the home of the "Polish Voice", a well-known publication in the Polish community. Prominently located at the corner of Queen and Dovercourt, it is a long established and important local landmark.]
