
Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 1st day of October, 1979, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as Nos. 358-62 Dundas Street East, as a property of architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

Nos. 358-62 Dundas Street East (semi-detached house) is recommended for designation for architectural reasons. The tradition of the Georgian style in house design of the period and the good source of bricks and local craftsmanship in 1867, when this semi-detached house was built, contribute to the importance of this building. The fine proportions of the windows, the doorway with transom and sidelights, the bay window with bell cast roof, a decorative corbelled brick cornice and pedimented dormers are special features of the facade.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of the 9th day of October, 1979. (File 1839).
