No. 510-75. A BY-LAW

To designate the T. Eaton Co. Limited, Eaton's College Street building at No. 412-448 Yonge Street of architectural value.

[Passed November 26, 1975.]

Whereas The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of historic or architectural value or interest; and

Whereas the Council of The Corporation of the City of Toronto has caused to be served upon the owner of the lands and premises known as the T. Eaton Co. Limited, Eaton's College Street building at No. 412-448 Yonge Street and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in a newspaper having a general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks; and

Whereas the reasons for the designation are set out as Schedule 'B' hereto; and

Whereas no notice of objection to the said proposed designation has been served upon the clerk of the municipality;

Therefore, the Council of The Corporation of the City of Toronto enacts as follows:

- 1. There is designated as being of architectural value or interest the real property, more particularly described in Schedule 'A' hereto, known as the T. Eaton Co. Limited, Eaton's College Street building at No. 412-448 Yonge Street.
- 2. The City Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule 'A' hereto in the proper land registry office.
- 3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the aforesaid property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the City of Toronto.

SCHEDULE "B"

Reasons for the designation of the T. Eaton Co. Limited, Eaton's College Street building at No. 412-448 Yonge Street

The T. Eaton Co. Limited, Eaton's College Street build, 412-448 Yonge Street at Hayter Street, through to 49 College Street (1917) 1928-33 by Ross & Macdonald; Sproatt & Rolph, Associates, is designated to be of architectural value as a notable example (though unfinished) of the type of large scale building using simplified classical forms that typifies commercial design in the 1920s and 1930s. The building coordinates the finest materials and workmanship with a scale rarely seen in Canada or in the work of Canadian architects. The building is also important because it effectively defines the intersection of Yonge and College streets setting the tone and scale for many of the buildings in the area.
