By-law No. 78 - 26

.....

A by-law to designate The Old Stamford Township Hall at 5810 Ferry Street of architectural value and of historic interest.

WHEREAS The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of historic or architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Niagara Falls has caused to be served upon the owner of the lands and premises municipally known as 5810 Ferry Street, commonly known as The Old Stamford Township Hall, upon The Ontario Heritage Foundation, Notice of Intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such Notice of Intention to be published in a news paper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of 3 consecutive weeks;

AND WHEREAS the reasons for designation are set out in Schedule "B" hereto;

AND WHEREAS no Notice of Objection to the proposed designation has been served upon the Clerk of the municipality.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NIAGARA FALLS ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the real property more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, known as The Old Stamford Township Hall at 5810 Ferry Street be designated as being of architectural value or interest.
2. The City Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper Land Registry Office.
3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the aforesaid property and upon The Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a news paper having general circulation in the City of Niagara Falls.

REASONS FOR DESIGNATION OF THE OLD STAMFORD TOWNSHIP HALL

The Old Stamford Township Hall, 5810 Ferry Street, built in 1874 was used for the Council meetings of the Township until amalgamation in 1963. It is a hammer dressed stone structure designed by a Niagara Falls architect of the time, Mr. John Latshaw. The building became a noted landmark in the south end of town.
