TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Anderdon intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, at the following municipal address as a property of architectural and historical value or interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O., 1980, Chapter 337.

REASONS FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION

The proposed designation is on both historical and architectural grounds. St. Joseph's Church was founded in 1864 by Rev. Father Francois Marseille who came from France. The present building was erected under the direction of Rev. Father Loiselle in 1910 on lands donated by Alexandre Beneteau. Architectural features of the building which are deserving of preservation include steeples, brick, statues, stained glass windows and wooden pews.

Notice of objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts may be served on the Clerk of the Township of Anderdon before the 17th day of May, 1985.
