REASONS FOR DESIGNATION

The designation described herein is recommended on historic and architectural grounds. This house was built in 1863 by Benjamin Burkholder, a well-known and respected teacher. In terms of architecture, the house is a fine example of the Waterloo County Georgian style.

WHEREAS Section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337, authorizes the Council of a Municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural or historical value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of
Kitchener has caused to be served on the owner of the lands and premises
known municipally as 883 Doon Village Road in the City of Kitchener, and
upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, a Notice of Intention to Designate as
being of historic and architectural value that part of the aforesaid real
property more particularly hereinafter described, and has caused such Notice
of Intention to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in
the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks;

AND WHEREAS no Notice of Objection to the proposed designation has been served upon the Clerk of the Municipality;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Kitchener enacts as follows:

- 1. There is designated as being of historic and architectural value that part of the aforesaid real property known as 883

 Doon Village Road being comprised of the three bay front facade, the two side facades all having windows with six panes over six panes, the front door complete with transom and side lights, the one-storey verandah with turned posts which extends across the front of the house, the gable roof with return eaves, the small square attic windows and the two chimneys at either end of the gable roof.
- 2. The City Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-law to be registered against the whole of the property described in Schedule "A" hereto (of which the said designated area forms a part) in the proper land registry office.
- 3. The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-law



SCHEDULE "A"

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ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises, situate, lying and being in the City of Kitchener, in the Peqional Municipality of Waterloo (formerly the County of Waterloo) and Province of Ontario, having an area of 1.322 acres and being composed of Part of Lot Number 2, in Biehn's Tract, in the said City of Kitchener, more particularly described as follows:
