Gentlemen:

Council for the Corporation of the City of Windsor at its regular meeting held January 15, 1979 adopted the enclosed resolution regarding "Notice of Intention to Designate" the <u>Reinhold Gluns House, 3730 Sandwich Street</u> pursuant to provisions of the <u>Ontario Heritage Act</u>.

The reasons for the proposed designation of the property are:

- (a) it represents a combination of late Gothic Revival and Queen Anne styles of Architecture
- (b) Reinhold Gluns, established a tannery and also served as Town Councilman and Reeve of Sandwich

The following recommendation of the Windsor Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee was adopted by Council at its meeting held on January 15, 1979:

 WHEREAS the Windsor Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee in accordance with Council's resolution of October 16, 1978, has held further
discussions with Mr. Fortin regarding the proposed designation of 3730 Sandwich Street being the Reinhold Gluns House; and

WHEREAS Mr. Fortin on behalf of the owners indicated that they are no longer opposed to a "Notice of Intention to Designate" said property;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED"that "Notice of Intention to Designate" the Reinhold Gluns House, 3730 Sandwich Street, owned by Marie J. Fortin (Hi Ho Curb Service) 5240 Tecumseh Rd. E. as a property of architectural and historic significance be given for the following reasons and that a metes and bounds description of the property be employed providing for an additional one (1) foot of land around the perimeter of the structure:

(a) the 2-storey structure built of red brick in 1885 is a combination of late Gothic Revival and Queen Anne styles of architecture in the use of shingle trim and intricate wood ornament of a small scale;

(b) the windows are emphasized by heavily detailed hoods;

(c) the bays and eaves are bracketed;

(c) Reinhold Gluns, a German immigrant, established a Tannery at Hill and Russell Streets and also served as Town Councilman in 1881 and Reeve 1886-7."
