BY-LAW NUMBER 155-1998

A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE LANDS AND PREMISES SITUATE WITHIN THE CITY OF WINDSOR, KNOWN AS THE SANDWICH FIRE HALL AND STABLE, 363 MILL STREET, IN THE CITY OF WINDSOR, TO BE OF ARCHITECTURAL AND/OR HISTORIC VALUE OR INTEREST UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT, R.S.O. 1990, CHAPTER O.18, AS AMENDED

Passed the 19th day of May, 1998.

BILL No.165 1998

WHEREAS by virtue of the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter O.18, as amended, the Council of a municipality may, by by-law, designate a property within the municipality to be of historic or architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS upon consideration of the recommendation of the Windsor Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee, The Corporation of the City of Windsor deems it desirable and expedient to designate part of Lot 5, Registered Plan 40, municipally known as 363 Mill Street, Windsor, to be of historic or architectural value or interest, for the reasons stated in Schedule "A" annexed hereto and forming part of this by-law;

AND WHEREAS notice of intention to so designate the subject property was served on the owner(s) of the subject property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, and such notice was published in a newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once a week for three consecutive weeks;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection was served on the Clerk of the Corporation.

THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Windsor enacts as follows:

1. That the above defined subject property be and the same is hereby designated to be of architectural and/or historic value or interest.

2. That this by-law shall come into force and effect after the final passing thereof on the day upon which if is registered in the Land Registry Office for Essex (No. 12).

SCHEDULE "A"

REASONS FOR DESIGNATION

Sandwich Fire Hall, 363 Mill Street, Windsor

Historical

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The former fire hall (1921) and stable (pre 1915) are Sandwich landmarks.

The fire hall was designed by local Architect Gilbert J.P. Jacques.

The original plans drawn by Gilbert J.P. Jacques, are available.

The fire hall occupies a prominent site on Mill Street, one of Sandwich's important early streets.

Artchitectural

In spite of a fire in the 1940's which destroyed the gable and hose tower belfry, enough of the fire hall remains to recall its original use.

The stable, while somewhat altered, is possibly the only surviving fire hall stable in the City.
