## BY-LAW 1987-19

# BEING A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE HOME OF AT 267 LAMBTON STREET AS BEING OF HISTORICAL OR ARCHITECTURAL VALUE

WHEREAS the Ontario Heritage Act, 1980, authorizes the council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of historic or architectural value and interest; and

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Kincardine has caused to be served on the owner of the lands and premises at 267 Lambton Street known as the home of and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation notices of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in a newspaper having general each of three circulation in the municipality once for consecutive weeks; and

WHEREAS the reasons for designation are set out in Schedule "B" hereto:

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Kincardine ENACTS as follows:

- There is designated as being of architectural value and interest the real property more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, known as the home of at 267 Lambton Street.
- The clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper land registry office.
- The clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of the By-law to be served upon the owner of the aforesaid property and З. upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this By-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the Town of Kincardine.

READ a FIRST and SECOND time this 19th day of February, 1987.

READ a THIRD time and FINALLY PASSED this 5th day of March,

#### SCHEDULE "A"

### SCHEDULE FOR DESCRIPTION

Part of Lot 7 on the north side of Lambton Street, Town of Kincardine, County of Bruce, being more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the north-east angle of said Lot Number Seven;

THENCE in a southerly direction along the easterly limit of said Lot to the south-east angle thereof;

THENCE westerly along the southerly limit of said Lot a distance of seventy feet six inches  $(70^{\circ}6^{\circ})$ ;

THENCE in a northerly direction parallel to the westerly limit of said Lot to the north limit thereof;

THENCE easterly along the northerly limit of said Lot a distance of seventy feet six inches (70°6") to the north-east angle thereof to the point of commencement, as in Instrument No. 151723.

#### SCHEDULE "B"

#### REASONS:

267 Lambton Street is an excellent example of Ontario Gothic architecture. This, the most popular type of Bruce County House in the late 19th Century, features a front dormer with decorative trim and gothic window, a large front verandah and storey and a half construction.

The house, which dates back to the 1870's, was built for approximately \$1,200.00 by its original owner, Jonas Vanstone. Some of its best known owners were Robert Baird, John Gettes, Andrew Malcolm and Dr. Helliwell.

The following features are considered essential for architectural conservation:

The decorative large board trim on the dormer and gable ends; the front dormer and dormer window; the front verandah and supporting wooden columns; and the wooden shutters.
