TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Cornwall intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, known municipally as 224 Second Street East as a property of architectural and historical value or interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, S.O. Chapter 337.

Reasons for the Proposed Designation

Dr. Fraser's House, 224 Second Street East, is recommended for designation because it is of historical and architectural importance. An outstanding local example of late Victorian architecture, this two and one-half storey residence was built circa 1883 for Mr. J.F. Smart, Deputy Sheriff of Cornwall. Later owned by Charles Sargent, the Resident Engineer of the St. Lawrence Canal. the home since 1945 has been the treasured possession of Its attractive red brick sits on a rusticated cut stone foundation. A gabled porch, extensive ornamental woodwork, door and window mouldings, ornamental chimneys and full gabled dormers are outstanding exterior features to be admired and preserved.

Notice of objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts may be served on the Clerk of the City of Cornwall before the 9th day of May, 1984,
