NOTICE OF INTENTION

TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the Township of Ramsay on the 1st day of October, 1980, established its intention to designate the building, known municipaly as the MILL OF KINTAIL, situated on Parts Lots 23 and 24, concession 8, Township of Ramsay, as a building of historic and architectural value or interest, under the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, R.S.O., 1974 as amended.

STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATIONS

The MILL OF KINTAIL is recommended for designation as being of architectural and historic value, this is a three story building of traditional Ottawa Valley stone construction.

In 1932 the property was purchased by R. Tait McKenzie and converted to a summer home and studio. It is now owned by the Mississippi Valley Conservation Authority and contains a number of examples of R. Tait McKenzies sculptures and furniture, and agricultural artifacts acquired in Dr. McKenzies lifetime.

ANY PERSON MAY within thirty (30) days of the 24th day of December, 1980, serve by registered mail or personally deliver to the Clerk of the Township of Ramsay, notice of objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all the relevant facts.
