TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Newmarket intends to designate the lands municipally known as 227 Church Street and 439 D'Arcy Street, Town of Newmarket, Regional Municipality of York. (St. Paul's Anglican Church and Rectory).

REASONS FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION

Saint Paul's Anglican Church and Rectory located at 227 Church Street and 439 D'Arcy Street is significant for historical and architectural reasons. The church was constructed in 1883-1884 replacing the first St. Paul's Church which was built in 1834. This was one of the first Church of England parishes in York County and was served by missionaries in the early 19th century. The building illustrates the work of architect Marshall B. Aylesworth whose projects included churches in Aurora, Markdale, Almonte, and Owen Sound.

The church and adjacent rectory complement one another with features identified with gothic revival design, a style favoured for residential and ecclesiastical building during the late 1800's. The church is constructed of brick, wood and stone and faced with courses of grey rock-faced limestone taken from the Lake Couchiching area. The brick is from the Stickwood Brickyard once located on Srigley Street. The tower bell was used for many years to signal fires and now continues to be used at most services including weddings and funerals.
