#### **BY-LAW NUMBER 2007-112**

A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE A PROPERTY AS BEING OF ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL VALUE OR INTEREST.

(St. Paul's Church and Rectory - 227 Church Street and 439 D'Arcy Street)

WHEREAS Section 29 of the *Ontario Heritage Act R.S.O. 1990* authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural or historic value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Newmarket has caused to be served on the owner of the lands and premises of Lots 67, 68, and 70 of Plan 81; Part Lots 66, 72, and 79 of Plan 81, Town of Newmarket, Regional Municipality of York, known as 227 Church Street and 439 D'Arcy Street, and upon the Ontario Heritage Trust, notice of intention to designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the municipality for two consecutive weeks.

THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Newmarket as follows:

- There is designated as being of architectural and historical value or interest the real property described in Schedule "A" attached, comprising the footprint of the buildings described in Schedule "B" attached.
- 2. The reasons for designation of Lots 67, 68, and 70 of Plan 81; Part Lots 66, 72, and 79 of Plan 81, Town of Newmarket, Regional Municipality of York, known as 227 Church Street and 439 D'Arcy Street, are described in Schedule "B" hereto.
- 3. The Municipal Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper land registry office.
- 4. The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served on the owner of the aforesaid property and on the Ontario Heritage Trust and to cause notice of the passing of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the municipality for two consecutive weeks.

#### SCHEDULE "B" TO BY-LAW 2007-112

### **REASONS FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION**

Saint Paul's Anglican Church and Rectory located at 227 Church Street and 439 D'Arcy Street is significant for historical and architectural reasons. The church was constructed in 1883-1884 replacing the first St. Paul's Church which was built in 1834. This was one of the first Church of England parishes in York County and was served by missionaries in the early 19<sup>th</sup> century. The building illustrates the work of architect Marshall B. Aylesworth whose projects included churches in Aurora, Markdale, Almonte, and Owen Sound.

The church and adjacent rectory complement one another with features identified with gothic revival design, a style favoured for residential and ecclesiastical building during the late 1800's. The church is constructed of brick, wood and stone and faced with courses of grey rock-faced limestone taken from the Lake Couchiching area. The brick is from the Stickwood Brickyard once located on Srigley Street. The tower bell was used for many years to signal fires and now continues to be used at most services including weddings and funerals.
