NOTICE OF DESIGNATING BY-LAW

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa on the 20th day of February , 1980, enacted By-law Number 62-80 designating the lands and buildings known municipally as 188 St. Andrew Street as a property of architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, Statutes of Ontario 1974, Chapter 122, as amended.

STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR THE DESIGNATION:

The Foisey House, at 188 St. Andrew Street, is recommended for designation as being of architectural value. This one and one-half storey clapboard cladded dwelling was erected in 1859-1860 for Alexis Foisey, an early Ottawa tinsmith, who resided here until 1876. Gable side-to-the street, with matching dormers, this Vernacular Style building features a decorative tin ceiling and S-scroll newel post on the interior.

In its overall exterior appearance, the property is a rare surviving example of typical workman's housing in Lowertown from the pre-Confederation era.

A by-law of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa to designate 188 St. Andrew Street to be of architectural value or interest;

> WHEREAS The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, Statutes of Ontario, 1974, Chapter 122, as amended, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa has caused to be served upon the owner of the lands and premises known as 188 St. Andrew Street more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in Le Droit newspaper having a general circulation in the City of Ottawa, once a week for three consecutive weeks, namely on October 27, 1979, November 3, 1979 & November 10, 1979;

AND WHEREAS the reasons for the designation are set out as Schedule "B" hereto;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the said proposed designation has been served upon the Clerk of the City of Ottawa;

THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa enacts as follows:-

1. There is designated as being of architectural value or interest the real property, more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, known as .188 St. Andrew Street

;

2. The City Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper Land Registry Office.

3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the property described in Schedule "A", and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having a general circulation in the City of Ottawa.

4. The Schedules attached hereto and marked Schedule "A" and Schedule "B" form part of this by-law and all notations, references and other information contained therein shall be as much a part of this by-law as if all the matters and information set forth by the said schedules were all fully described herein.
